

Overview of the Rapid Response over the years

6 requests received since 2018

Dominican Republic Chad Cyprus Ghana North Macedonia Somalia

3 positive outcomes

Reestablishment of the Court of Accounts in Chad

Appointment of an AG in North Macedonia

Audit Bill approved by the Parliament in Somalia

4 statements of concerns issued





Rapid Response: points for consideration

- SIRAM as a tool is gaining popularity at the global level and in the SAI community
- INTOSAI is considered as a credible voice on SAI Independence both at the global and country level
- Effective advocacy is highly dependent on greater coordination and follow-up at the country level
- Effective advocacy could be enhanced by the establishment of a continuous monitoring function to identify windows of opportunity
