Exit strategies

What's next for the P2P workstream?

- Aim to meet with sufficient regularity to ensure momentum and maintain effective connections between SAIs
- To work sustainably: make best use of technology and to limit travel to the minimum level necessary. Most sessions will be virtual
- An inclusive approach: we seek representation from all regions, and aim to increase SAI participation
- A focus on analysing the results of the EU P2P mapping study, extract lessons and discuss the way forward and next steps. Topics to include:
 - Consider changing trends around how peer-to-peer support levels
 - Explore regional disparities on where support is provided from/to
 - Find solutions to barriers that prevent more SAIs entering into peer-to-peer arrangements
 - Deep dive into donor arrangements and funding sources
